Three opportunities:

Host a workshop

Workshops:

- provide opportunities to learn, reflect, practice and plan
- require a suitable space and at least six participants (the workshop will be made available wider than the hosting meeting)
- typically run from 10.30—4pm on weekends (but could be a half day)
- cost £5 per participant (payable on the day).

Request a workshop for your meeting on one of a variety of topics:

- being ready for children and families
- an introduction to Quaker children and young people's work
- worshipping all together
- babies and toddlers in Quaker meeting
- · building relationships with children
- exploring the spiritual with young people
- working with small numbers across a wide age range
- storytelling (exploring Godly Play).

Consider how all are welcome

Be supported in making your meeting welcoming to all through considering some of the advices and queries in the *All are welcome* resource. Friends will visit your meeting to work with you to explore what your meeting might do and how to begin. If it is helpful, follow up visits will be arranged. A £60 charge is made for each request met.

Explore together

Have a session to explore growing as all-age community. This might be at:

- an area/local meeting morning, afternoon or day.
- a session for elders and overseers
- another occasion that suits your meeting.

Who meets the requests?

These opportunities are offered by the Children and Young People's Work Training Team — a part of the Quaker Life Network — supported by the Children and Young People's Work staff in Friends House. They are Friends with experience in children and young people's work; they are also skilled at facilitating groups of adults. They have a desire for Quakerism to be for people of all ages. Usually two members from this team would meet any request made.
