




SEEN AND UNSEEN: ways of being along Quaker and Buddhist paths Peter Jarman £3.00

Today many understand God as a creation of human consciousness. God is poetry, a symphony of poems. Whether seen or unseen, what is perceived enlivens our being. What is known is what we can hold on to; what is unknown is mystical and mystery, a cloud of unknowing. *Seen and Unseen* explores these two aspects of reality. In the first part it describes them in the experience of Quaker and Buddhist faith and practice, and in the Sea of Faith movement. In the second part the author, a Quaker scientist, focuses on our universe and its fundamental principles, interactions and energies. They will reveal their wonder and beauty, and their anchor on what is ultimate reality, seen and unseen. For reflection at home or with a workshop study group.

What is the role of scripture in illuminating the lives of the faithful today? In this book, three experts in Judaism, Christianity and Islam respectively discuss and debate this question, by exploring the core messages of the Torah, Bible and Qu'ran. Taking a deeper look at the wide range of theological, political and social issues that divide (and sometimes unite) their religions, they reveal how inspiration and guidance can be drawn not only on life's big questions such as sin and the afterlife, but also on societal issues including war, suffering, marriage and justice.
